DISTRICT PROFILE

The Morgan Hill Unified School District has 2 comprehensive senior high schools with a student population total of about 2,500 in grades 9-12. The school's curriculum offers challenging Advance Placement (AP) courses and great extracurricular programs that stimulate learning and achievement. Each year the district invites a select group of international students to take part in its typical American academic and social activities.

Ann Sobrato High School's campus includes 9 single-story buildings. The facilities have 4 classroom buildings, a theater/auditorium, an athletic center with full size gymnasium, administration building, aquatic center, counseling/resource center and library building. Live Oak High School was founded over 100 years ago and has recently undergone major renovations and technology infrastructure upgrades. New facilities include a theater and amphitheater area, locker rooms, replacement of the school's façade and a new digital marquee. Both high schools are Gold Ribbon recipients.

SPORTS AND ARTS

The District excels in both its art and athletic programs. Ann Sobrato High School has won many sport championships in recent years and Live Oak High School's Drama Guild has earned repeated recognition from the American Musical Theater's Honors program.

COMMUNITY INFORMATION


